PROGRAM REVIEW

Duration: 15/02/2018 – 15/02/2021 (36 months)

Location: Armenia and Georgia.

In Georgia, activities will be implemented in Samegrelo, Samtskhe-Javakheti, Imereti and Mtskheta-Mtianeti region.

Implemented by: World Vision Deutschland VE (DE), “Global Development” Fund (AM), Association “Anika” (GE), and Georgia Farmers’ Association (GE)

World Vision Germany designed the EU4Youth initiative in close collaboration with World Vision Armenia, World Vision Georgia, and the Global Developments Fund, to address unemployment for youth in rural areas.

SKILLS FOR JOBS project will target young women and men aged between 15 and 35 years old, particularly those with fewer opportunities and support them to get a job or start their own business.

ACTIONS IN BRIEF

- **Supporting youth develop the skills for employment.**

SKYE (Skills and Knowledge For Youth Economic Opportunities) model helps the disadvantaged youth develop the skills, behaviors, and attitudes necessary to obtain sustainable livelihoods and participate constructively in their communities.

A SKYE Club typically consists of approximately 20-25 youth (aged 18-26). The clubs are led by SKYE Club Volunteer Leaders in the community. These Leaders use a curriculum based on experiential learning methodologies to help the members cultivate competencies in the areas of active citizenship, leadership, employability and entrepreneurship.

16  **SKYE clubs,**

in the **4** regions of Georgia, will be established so that

320 young adults can meet weekly for 2-3 hours to have fun, learn, and serve their communities together.



- **Catch-up Programme for early school leavers**

Catch-up strategy will be developed and piloted in order to decrease the risks of drop outs of school students in for regions of Georgia.

- **Needs and Skill-based inclusive VET programs**

The project will also develop a work-based learning (WBL) tool for three agrarian and agro-tourism professions. Also, within the project, e-learning programs will be developed as a complementary tool to the formal and non-formal educational programs in the agrarian and agro-tourism sectors.

Capacity building programs will be conducted for the agrarian sector VET teachers, administrative staff and professional orientation and counselling managers/ specialist.

Also, raising awareness campaigns will be conducted to promote professional education opportunities for vulnerable young boys and girls in the Agriculture sector of Georgia.

- **Assistance to youth support structures**

Coordination meeting will be organized biannually to support partnership between youth structures at municipal and national level.

The disability component is mainstreamed through entire project with the support of local partner organization Anika
