

Ukraine Crisis Response in Georgia

During the rapidly evolving humanitarian crisis, World Vision works with the local authorities, displaced community groups and partners to provide desperately needed humanitarian assistance to Ukrainian refugees in Georgia. With its response plan, WV aims to reach 6000 most vulnerable Ukrainians over the course of 1 year.

World Vision's main activities are focused on:

- ✦ Providing direct humanitarian assistance
- ✦ Facilitating access to education, healthcare, accommodation, and employment for Ukrainian refugees
- ✦ Supporting children and women with child protection, gender-based violence, and regular psychosocial services
- ✦ Supporting local authorities to address the needs of refugees

World Vision Georgia's approach is to complement the National Government's and other partners' Response Actions to increase the impact.

Detailed services/activities provided to Ukrainian refugees:

- ✦ Multi-purpose cash assistance to help refugees cover their most urgent and immediate needs until employment
- ✦ Support temporary reception centers along the major border crossing points together with the Government of Georgia
- ✦ Music and dance synthetic sessions for refugee children (6-18 years)
- ✦ Various Psychological services/counseling for children and their families
- ✦ Teaching, learning and recreational supplies, equipment for educational institutions accommodating Ukrainian children
- ✦ Informational meetings on gender-based violence for refugees and host communities
- ✦ Informational meetings on available education, healthcare, social, employment, and other services
- ✦ Awareness raising campaigns on child protection, gender-based violence, and mental health/psychosocial well-being

Who can benefit from services?

The project services are accessible to all citizens of Ukraine and those with permanent residence, who entered/will enter Georgia and are unable to return to Ukraine because of the ongoing crisis.

People who meet one or more of these criteria will be eligible to receive support.

- ✦ Single parent/caregiver with children;
- ✦ Older person-at risk;
- ✦ Individual with disability;
- ✦ Individual with a serious medical condition;
- ✦ Individual with specific legal and physical protection needs (including survivors of torture);
- ✦ SGBV survivor;
- ✦ Women and girls at risk;
- ✦ Child-at-risk
- ✦ Families with child/children

Women, children, people living with disabilities, the elderly and other vulnerable groups will be prioritized, ensuring negative barriers that exist for these groups are addressed.
