The aim of the project is to strengthen health and child protection systems affected by COVID-19 in Georgia.

The project is implemented in 15 Municipalities in 5 regions of Georgia:

the capital Tbilisi (all 5 Municipalities), Imereti (Kutaisi, Zestafoni, Bagdati), Kakheti (Telavi, Gurjaani, Kvareli), Samtskhe-Javakheti (Adigeni, Akhaltsikhe, Borjomi) and Adjara (Batumi).



#### **Project directions**

- 1. Raising awareness about immunization and health issues
- 2. Strengthening health and child protection systems in the country
- 3. Providing targeted assistance to state care facilities

#### **Target groups**

- Street connected children living in daycare and intervention centres.
- People with disabilities, including children, elderly people, girls and women who are victims of violence living in state centres/facilities
- Most vulnerable women
- Family doctors and general practitioners
- Psychologists
- Community health workers
- Municipal social workers

#### Main activities:

- Identify communication and information gaps concerning immunization.
- Develop training modules and materials on relevant health topics, such as immunization, regular child vaccinations, TB, HepC, HepB, STD, HIV prevention and other diseases.
- Train health personnel and community social workers on how to disseminate information about public health.
- Conduct information sessions for vulnerable women and girls and their family members on vaccination, reproductive health, violence against women and other important topics.
- Implement community projects with local level groups for awareness raising about immunization and other important health issues.
- Support medical online communication practices by advancing the skills of family doctors.
- Provide Public Health Centres with the needed equipment.
- Strengthen referral mechanisms and procedures concerning Child Protection cases.
- Advocate for adding health workers to child protection units/ multi-disciplinary groups.
- Conduct assessment on the needs of vulnerable groups living in state care centres and develop recommendations.
- Provide targeted assistance to vulnerable groups based on findings.
- Organize advocacy meetings on national and municipal levels for resource mobilization for further social assistance for vulnerable groups.
